Eagle's Landing Middle School Student Represents Henry County in Essay Contest

Simeon Hambrick, a student at Eagle's Landing Middle School, is the Henry County winner in the sixth annual water conservation and water quality essay contest, sponsored by the Metropolitan North Georgia Water Planning District (Water District). The Water District is a planning entity dedicated to developing comprehensive watershed, wastewater and water supply and conservation plans to be implemented by local governments in the 16-county metro Atlanta region. The Clean Water Campaign and Water Use It Wisely are public education campaigns designed to educate and promote behavior changes in water conservation and water quality.

Hambrick will receive an award at Eagle's Landing Middle School on Wednesday, December 19, 2007. Reid Bowman, Sr., Henry County Commissioner, presented Simeon Hambrick with the County Award. Commissioner Bowman said, "Henry County is one of the 61 counties included in the history making drought. As a policy maker in Henry County, it is my job to implement policies and laws to preserve our community resources. But I can not do it alone; we need the support from the community, Hambrick has begun by educating others through his essay." In Hambrick's essay, he says, "We are in a drought right now and we need to conserve water at home, work and school. You can start by repairing faucets and leaky toilets, installing ultra low-flow showerheads, not running water while we shave our face, and brush our teeth. Every miniature drop of water counts toward conservation. Society must learn to conserve water at home, school and work. Everyone can make a difference."

The two campaigns, Clean Water Campaign and Water Use It Wisely, teamed up to encourage children and parents to address the growing need to improve water quality and conservation efforts in Georgia. Students researched and shared their thoughts on why conserving water and preventing water pollution are important for the future of their river, lakes and streams. The main goal of this program is to encourage students to create inventive solutions to water conservation and water quality in metro North Georgia.

The contest was open to sixth, seventh and eighth graders in Bartow, Cherokee, Clayton, Cobb, Coweta, DeKalb, Douglas, Fayette, Fulton, Forsyth, Gwinnett, Hall, Henry, Paulding, Rockdale and Walton Counties. Each participating school submitted its winning essay for the county competition, and one overall winner was selected from among the county winners. County winners receive a \$25 check along with a Clean Water Campaign / Water Use It Wisely certificate presented by an elected official from that county.
